



SERMON

HYMN OF THE DAY: I Come With Joy

NICENE CREED

(ELW p. 105)

Together let us confess our faith using the words from the Nicene Creed.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. (ELW 482)

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God. begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son,* who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified. who has spoken through the prophets. Make us to be broken bread and poured-out wine that we may give back to you what you have first given us, and that we may feed those hungering for your Word and slack the thirst of those seeking for your love. Lord in your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

As spring arrives and green leaves burst forth and flowers emerge, grant the warmth and gentle rains of springtime upon us all, O Lord, and protect us all from the severe storms that often darken our springtime skies. Help our farmers and ranchers to raise the food for our tables, and the fishermen to bring in bountiful catches. Let us fill our barns not just for ourselves but for the benefit of our neighbors. 

LORD'S PRAYER






Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.
